Dear staff, participants, caregivers, and friends,

In order to minimize the risks of transmitting COVID-19 for Elderhaus and Mindset participants and staff during the current pandemic surge, Elderhaus is requiring all staff, volunteers, and participants who are eligible for COVID-19 booster vaccinations to provide documentation of having a booster shot, starting Monday, January 10, 2022. Individuals who are not yet eligible for booster shots will be required to get their booster within 14 days of becoming eligible.


This action is taken in view of the increasing surge of cases of COVID-19 along with the current widespread availability of vaccinations, as reported by the Larimer County Department of Health and the Environment. We also ask everyone to be diligent about staying home if anyone in your household has any symptoms consistent with COVID-19. This includes relatively minor symptoms like congestion or a runny nose.
