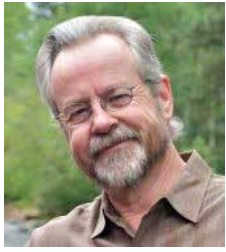


Dementia Not Barrier to Outings with Friends

Margie likes to recall how she ran a much-loved bakery. At the relatively young age of 82, Margie's mid-stage dementia has not

diminished her easy, winning smile, and she is instantly likeable. However, as her health has declined and loved ones passed away, her support system dwindled down to one old friend and the friend's daughter. Since that kind family first welcomed Margie to live in their Loveland home, the level of daytime supervision and care she needs is more than Margie can afford and more than these friends can provide.

Thanks to our program, with costs partially covered by scholarship assistance through our partners at the Larimer County Office on Aging, this delightful woman enjoys social engagement, cognitive stimulation, tasty nutrition, and safe physical activities—including helping fellow participants deliver Meals on Wheels—several days
